79 % of the households served by Càritas Catalunya are in a situation of severe poverty

The organization highlights the growing job insecurity and the urgent need to guarantee decent housing

In a context of a notable decrease in purchasing power and the incorporation of the concept of working poverty, Càritas Catalunya presented its annual report for 2023 last Tuesday, highlighting that an alarming 79% of households served are in a situation of severe poverty. Francesc Roig Queralt, president of Càritas Catalunya, emphasized that this data is a reflection of the serious crisis affecting Catalan society.

According to the report, during 2023 Cáritas Catalunya served 99,535 households, where a total of 245,665 people live, of which more than half have children and teenagers in their care. The main hallmarks of care homes include a high rate of job insecurity, serious problems accessing decent housing and a generatiTHE FIGURES

onal transmission of poverty. The data also reveal that 54% of households in extreme poverty have children or teenagers, and 61% of these households cannot guarantee adequate food. In addition, 44% cannot pay school fees and 59% do not have internet or mobile, aspects that aggravate their situation of vulnerability. Regarding the type of families requesting help, 54% are families with children or teenagers, and 22% are single-parent households, which present a higher risk of child poverty. In terms of gender, poverty is feminized, with 59% women among the people served. By age group, more than half are adults, although the number

of young people and minors is also significant. 27% of the people served live alone. In relation to the employment situation, 46% are active, but unemployed, while 33% correspond to pensioners or people who are not looking for work.

Of the total number of people served, 41% are in an irregular administrative situation, mainly of Latin American and Central American origin. Càritas Catalunya, which has a budget of 50 million euros, has allocated 51% of the expenditure to the social sector. The organization also highlighted the importance of job placement as a tool to combat poverty and underlined the need to continue working to dilute social



polarization. Josep Casanova, vice president of Càritas Catalunya and director of Càritas Urgell, highlighted the effort to professionalize the organization, which has 530 contracted people and 12,000 volunteers. The event was attended by the vicar general of the Dioce-

se of Urgell, Josep Mauri, representing the episcopal co-prince Joan-Enric Vives, and Marta Fortuny, coordinator of the Social Area of Càritas Catalunya and deputy director of Càritas Diocesana d'Urgell, who highlighted the work carried out by the 10 Catalan dioceses and fu-

Thus, Monsignor Antoni Elvira will from now on be rector of the parish of Sant Pere Màrtir of Escaldes-Engordany, replacing Monsignor Jaume Soy, who is retiring. The change to Encamp also meant that a replacement for Elvira as rector had to be appointed in Santa Eulàlia, which from now on will pass to Alex Vargas, who will also be diocesan youth delegate, diocesan judge of the ecclesiastical court and deputy general secretary of the Diocese of Urgell •
