

# Support for the Government deflates while Concòrdia expands its political space

The survey reflects the growth of the opposition, with Escalé's leadership at the forefront

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The Andorran political climate is being redefined. This is confirmed by the Spring 2025 Political Survey, prepared by the Sociology Group, which draws a scenario of cooling in institutional support for the Government and a low perception of generalized trust towards political representatives. All this in a context of very fragmented voting intention and with a large percentage of undecided people.

In relation to the assessment of the Government, the results show a downward trend: the

Executive led by Xavier Espot obtains an average score of 5.1 points this year, a significant decrease compared to the 6.1 regis-

tered in 2023 and the 6.7 in 2020. This wear is extended to the parliamentary groups that support it, which lose half a point com-

red to last year and are located at an average rating of 5.4. A continued decline since the peak of 6.3 reached in 2020.

On the contrary, the opposition groups maintain or improve their positioning. Concòrdia stands out in particular, with an average score of 5.8 points, slightly higher than in 2024. Andorra Endavant achieves a rating of 5.7 points, followed by the Social Democratic Party (PS) with 5.4 points and Social Democracy and Progress (SDP) with 5.0 points.

The assessment of political leaders also reflects this rebalancing. Although Xavier Espot remains the best-known leader (97.8%) and with the highest spontaneous recognition as a preference (37.1%), his average score drops to 5.57 points. He is surpassed by Cerni Escalé, from Concòrdia, with an average score of 6.40, followed by Pere Baró (5.31) and Carine Montaner (5.07).

The degree of trust towards Andorran politicians stands at 4.9 points, a stagnant value since 2023 and far from the highest records of a decade ago. This disaffection is reinforced by the general assessment of the political system, which remains very low: only 20.5% of respondents consider it good or very good, while 41.3% describe it as bad or very bad, and nearly a third give it a neutral assessment. However, it is worth noting that 47.8% of citizens have not yet decided their vote. ●

## Trump's return to the White House generates growing concern among Andorran people

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The figure of Donald Trump continues to generate a strong impact on an international scale, and Andorra is no exception. According to the latest Spring 2025 Political Survey, Trump's return to the presidency of the United States is causing clear concern among Andorran citizens, who maintain a high level of interest in the political development of the North American country.

61.3% of respondents say they follow United States politics with great or quite a lot of inte-

rest, a figure that reinforces the media and strategic weight of Washington in the Andorran political imagination. In this context, the perception of Trump's second term is overwhelmingly negative: 54.4% say they feel concern, while 17.9% express fear. Only a minority shows positive feelings: 7.1% declare themselves optimistic and 2.9% have hope.

The qualitative data also provide nuances. Among the open-ended responses, expressions such as "disappointment", "worry", "surprise" or even "betrayal" are included. Others, with less statistical weight, show curiosity

or irony, and only isolated cases express admiration or agreement with some ideas of the current president of the United States.

Regarding the areas of perceived impact, the survey indicates a notable rejection of the figure of Trump in fundamental aspects of international politics. ●

## Concòrdia receives the citizen results with "prudence and responsibility"

The Concòrdia parliamentary group, led by Cerni Escalé, assessed the results of the 2025 Political Survey, presented by Andorra Research and Innovation, this Tuesday. According to the figures released, Concòrdia

would register an increase of 8 points in voting intention compared to the 2023 elections, reaching 29.4%, and placing itself as the second force, behind Democrats (35.1%). In terms of sympathy, the party obtained 18.4%, also in second position, and less than four points behind DA (22.2%). The PS and Andorra Endavant

are further away, with 11.3% and 8.9%, respectively. Regarding the assessment of the parliamentary groups, Concòrdia is the party with the best score, with an average of 5.5, ahead of DA, which obtained an exact 5, and above the average assessment of the Government, which failed with 4.7. Escalé's party assures that it rece-

ives these results with «prudence and responsibility», remembering that we are at the equator of the legislature. In this sense, it expresses its will to continue working to deliver its proposals, listening to the citizens and thinking about what is best for the country. Andorra Endavant expresses itself in a similar way, which has also thanked the voters for their trust and has committed to continuing to work for a "fairer, stronger and more sovereign" Andorra. ●

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
